**1979 No. 918****ASSOCIATED STATES****The Saint Vincent Termination of Association Order 1979***Laid before Parliament in draft**Made - - - - 26th July 1979**Coming into Operation 27th October 1979*

At the Court of Saint James, the 26th day of July 1979

Present,

The Counsellors of State in Council

Whereas Her Majesty, in pursuance of the Regency Acts 1937 to 1953, was pleased, by Letters Patent dated the 16th day of July 1979, to delegate to the six Counsellors of State therein named or any two or more of them full power and authority during the period of Her Majesty's absence from the United Kingdom to summon and hold on Her Majesty's behalf Her Privy Council and to signify thereat Her Majesty's approval for anything for which Her Majesty's approval in Council is required:

And whereas a draft of this Order has been laid before Parliament in accordance with section 17(2) of the West Indies Act 1967(a) and has been approved by a resolution of each House of Parliament:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth The Queen Mother and His Royal Highness The Prince Charles, Prince of Wales, being authorised thereto by the said Letters Patent, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 10(2) of the West Indies Act 1967 and all other powers enabling Her Majesty, do hereby, by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Privy Council, on Her Majesty's behalf order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Saint Vincent Termination of Association Order 1979.

(2) This Order shall come into operation on 27th October 1979.

2. The status of association of Saint Vincent with the United Kingdom is terminated as from the date on which this Order comes into operation.
